- Also DSW Shoes collects used or old shoes that they donate to third world countries.



Schoolhouse The Genesis Corporation is a organization formed in January 2017. Genesis, a non-profit, community development corporation, was created by a group of local individuals who were passionate in revitalizing and restoring Pitcairn and other distressed neighboring communities. The Genesis Advisory Board is excited about the progress of the Schoolhouse restoration at 582 6th Street. The exterior is 90% complete and they are working hard to generate donations for the interior. They are also very

happy to announce the collaboration with the Monroeville Public Library. The Library plans to offer programs and resources at the Schoolhouse which may include computer/internet usage, after school programs, senior activities, craft sessions and employment coaching. In addition to the library/community center, the advisory board is raising funds to establish the James R. Fox Pitcairn Historical Society, which includes the Pitcairn High School Alumni. An arts and cultural center and retail space is also included in the plans. One of the goals listed in the vision for the Schoolhouse is to seek the input of all citizens and groups in our community. The board is interested to hear your thoughts and ideas as to how to best use the space at the Schoolhouse and what services and opportunities would best serve the community. The advisory board is also open to discussions with entrepreneurs who may be looking for a unique space in the restored building. The anticipated funding needed for Phase I (first floor) is \$250,000. The board has identified funding resources, such as classroom and display naming rights, adopt-a-window and legacy donations. General donations such as buy-a-brick program, names on restored chalkboards and benches are already happening. Please visit PitcainHistory.com to learn, participate and donate. 
Food Bank Food Distribution First Wednesday of Each Month



Electric Bill Electric bills can be paid at the borough office, 609 Broadway, during regular business hours; online; or by using the secure drop box located out-

side the building. To pay online, log on to www.pitcairnborough.us. You'll find an icon portal that will take you to the bill paying site. To register, you will need your CID and account numbers found on your bill.

Garbage should be put out for collection no earlier than 6 p.m. the night before pick-up and should be in sealed trash bags, then put in leak proof trash cans that have a lid. Pick-up day will not move due to a holiday UNLESS THE HOLIDAY FALLS ON YOUR SCHEDULED PICK UP DAY. Changes to pick-up days: Thursday November 28 (Thanksgiving Day) will be picked up on Friday November 29 and pickup scheduled the week of Christmas will be moved one day.
